History

The Violet Study Club was organized in March 1906 in north Minneapolis and federated in 1907. They were affiliated with the Argosy and Pathfinders Clubs. The motto of the Violet Study Club was "Knowledge is Power". The purpose of the club was "self-improvement morally, socially, intellectually and spiritually". The club gave its members an opportunity to continue their education in such areas as poetry, art and literature. Each year a theme for study was selected. Meetings were held every other week from September through May.
