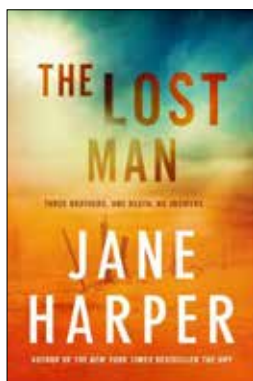

**The Vengeance of Mothers:

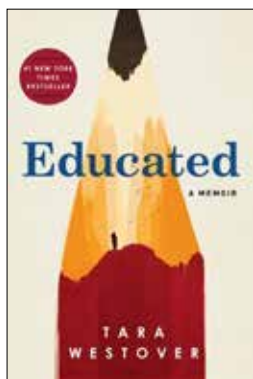

The Lost Man
