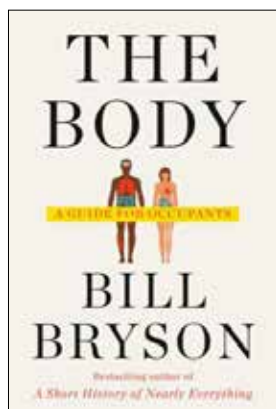

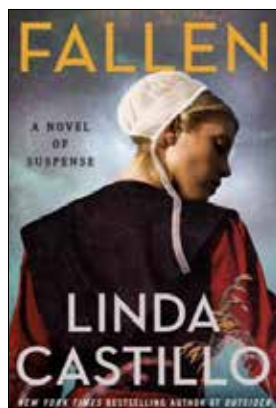
Reader Recommendations

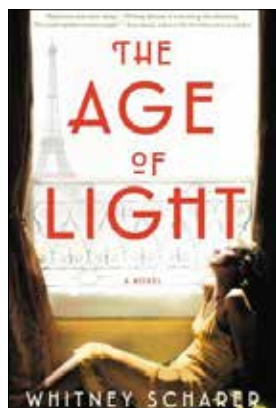
